On behalf of Associated Builders and Contractors (ABC), a national association of 72 chrepresenting nearly 22,000 members from more than 19,000 construction and inclustedy firms, I am writing in regard to the Senate Judiciary mapkof Title IV of the Border Security, Economic Opportunity, and Immigration Modernization Act (S. 744).

ABC has supported comprehensive immigration reform for many years and we are ence that the Senate bill includes wellafted approaches to border security

economic growth. Theonstruction industry will need about 1.8 million more workers 2020. This is based on BLS data that says there were 5.6 million construction w employed at the end of 2012; and a BLS projection that construction industry employme grow to alout 7.4 million by 2020. According to these numbers, the industry would roughly 225,000 more workers per year through the end of the decade.

For these reasons, we support amendment #9 introduced by Senators CoTiX)na(RI Lee (R-UT) that addresse the labor needs of the construction industry. We believe that
