The diverse coalition of undersigned associations and organizations representing the interests of tens of thousands of companies dmillions of skilled employees in the U.S. construction industry—building the foundation of America's economystrongly oppose your administration's efforts to encouraged require controversial government and ated project labor agreements on federal and federally assisted construction contracts funded by taxpayers.

The administration's flawed rationale justifyipgo-PLA policies³ ignores marketplace realities and broad opposition to governmentandated PLAswithin the construction industry. The truth is government mandated PLAs needlessincrease costsor taxpayers These jobsites pecific collective bargaining agreement unique to the construction industry unfairly limit competition by some of America's best contractors Iltimately, they exclude almost 9 out of 10 of the construction industry's workforce from the middle class jobs and benefits eated by government investment in infrastructure affordable housing and clean energy projects

When mandated by government agencies, PLAs can supersede and interfere with existing collective bargaining agreements contractors have already negotiated with various and contracting from using labor from certain unions, which is why some union organizations and contracting groups oppose government mandated PLAs.

For example, a PLA typically requires companies to agree to recognize unions as the representatives of their employees on that job, use the union hiring hall to obtain most or all construction labor, exclusively hire apprentices from union programs, follow union work rules and pay into union benefit and multiemployer pension plans his forcesemployers whose workers have freely made the choice not to join a union to pay "double benefits" into their existing employee bepleafits and union plans and places these qualifiefitms at a significant competitive disadvantage. In addition, research suggests that the few nonunion employees permitted to work on a PLA jobsite lose 34% of wages and benefits unless they pay union dues and/or join a union and meet benefits plan vesting schedusheart, these anti competitive provisions in typical PLAs promote wage their minate employee choicend make it extremely difficult for many nonunion, and typically small, minority womenewned firms to win public workscontracts subject to antiompetitive PLAs.

The administration's broad assertitionat businesses not affiliated with unions are unable to deliver safe, on-time, on-budget government construction projects while obeying federal labor laws aim to pigh wages to employees is unfounded. For examplifieral government data indicates that the approximately 2,000 largescale federal construction contracts procuired FY 2009 to FY2021 subject to President Obama's Executive Order 13502 Pic policy, at least 50% of contracts were awarded to prime contractors not signatory to unidensaddition, federal agency contracting officers chose to require PLAs on just 12 largescale federal construction contracts of more than 2,000 opportunities. There were no ports of widespread cost overruns, delays, labor unrest or possibity construction on no PLA projects indicating that PLA mandates are not needed to ensure economy and efficiency in government contracting.

However, government and ated PLAs on federal and federalls sisted projects during this time period have resulted in reduced competition, increased costs,, deal by socal hiring outcomes and litigation. In addition, multiple studies of hundreds of taxp and affordable housing and school construction projects found that government PLA mandates increase the cost of construction by 12% to 20% compared to similar not projects already subjected to state prevailing wage regulations

In short, hardworking taxpayers are getting less and paying more when PLAs are encouraged or mandated by the government on federal and federally assisted construction projected to the project description.
